- ✓ Update elected officials
- Present issues to residents and stakeholders at public event

Phase 2: Drilling down for solutions and opportunities

- Meet with the Steering
 Committee to review progress
- Develop strategies for implementation
- Meet with the Steering Committee to review progress


- Prepare a draft "workbook" describing work tasks and conclusions

QUESTIONNAIRE RESULTS SUMMARY

QUESTIONNAIRE

- Went live in May 2023
- 71% completion rate
- Average time spent: 12 minutes
- 594 total responses to date
 - > 92.5% Pleasant Hills homeowners
 - > 2.4% Pleasant Hills renters
 - 3.6% work or own a business in the borough

- Time spent living here
 - 53% have lived here more than 20 years
 - 33% have lived here5-20 years
 - 13% have lived here5 years
- Age breakdown
 - > 11% under 35
 - > 42% 35-54
 - **18%** 55-64
 - > 25% 65 or older



WHAT ARE THE BIGGEST CHANGES YOU WOULD LIKE TO SEE IN THE COMMUNITY?

- New/additional community spaces
- Improved and expanded sidewalks
- Increased enforcement of zoning/code ordinance and traffic laws
- Quality of road infrastructure and traffic management
- Local commercial activity



WHAT ISSUES WILL BE THE MOST IMPORTANT TO THE FUTURE OF PLEASANT HILLS?

Greatest percentage of #1 rankings:

- 1. Community safety (police, fire, EMS) (81.4%)
- 2. Attracting businesses to Pleasant Hills (68%)
- 3. Addressing the appearance of Route 51 and other commercial areas (61.2%)
- 4. Developing/revitalizing parks and recreational facilities (58.7%)
- 5. Communication with residents and business owners (57.7%)



KEY PERSON INTERVIEWS

RECOMMENDATIONS

Communications

The Borough will continue to provide high-quality community services with a focus on maintaining transparency, accessibility and accountability in public communications, both though traditional channels and those enabled by new technology.

- A day of recognition for exceptional public service
- The new borough building and associated conversations about where/how the borough provides facilities and public services
- Intentional communications strategies across multiple platforms, with capacity in mind
- Collaboration with Jefferson Regional Foundation, the school district and other entities



Old Clairton Road

Recognizing the importance of Old Clairton Road as the borough's major local thoroughfare, investments during the next decade will enhance the public realm, particularly to improve pedestrian conditions, to incorporate beautification that reinforces what's special about Pleasant Hills, and to set the stage for private investment that meets residents' needs.

- Improving the safety and appeal of walking routes between key community destinations
- Strategies and incentives for desired outcomes for sidewalks and parking
- Attracting desired investment and reinvestment
- Use streetscaping to reinforce a cohesive community feel



Community facilities

The borough will build upon its well-loved recreation offerings, providing and improving spaces that are inclusive, welcoming and foster community-building.

- Upgrade Mowry Park
- Explore new possibilities for AAA Park
- Kids activities and senior amenities
- Taking inventory of and improving existing facilities
- Opportunity cost of programming/understanding capacity



Safety and Property Maintenance

The Borough will continue to provide outstanding services that protect all residents, maintain vital infrastructure and promote the well-being and character of the community.

- Attracting young families, as well as keeping seniors comfortable in the borough, are goals that emerged across community engagement.
- Proactive strategies for property upkeep this could involve identifying needs for programs/support to maintain buildings and connecting homeowners with those resources
- Preserving home ownership opportunities
- Maintaining the current standard for public safety
- An opportunity for a review of the zoning/code ordinances to ensure that they consistently support borough goals
